## **NSW Reconstruction Authority**

The NSW Reconstruction Authority is currently undergoing a restructure to better serve communities in all aspects of the disaster cycle. New legislation has required the organisation to adapt and better reflect the responsibilities and approach required to deliver the skills and function which have not previously been applied. This will mean an increase in staff across the organisation and the inclusion of Identified staff in the Regions to better serve Indigenous communities. NSW Reconstruction Authority are pleased to announce the Deputy CEO – Simone Walker. Simone is formally from the NSW Department of Education and has also previously held the roles of Deputy Secretary, Strategy, Policy & Commissioning and Deputy Secretary, Operations, Child Protection & Out of Home Care at the Department of Communities and Justice. In these roles she led key program areas including housing, homelessness, disability support, child protection and out-of-home care, and domestic and family violence protection. Simone started her career as a frontline social worker and has a deep understanding of the critical interface between the public sector, service providers and NSW communities.

Two Executive Directors have been appointed for Regional Delivery – Susie George and Stephen Wills. Stephen previously held the position of Executive Director Regional Programs at the Department of Regional NSW. Stephen has previously held executive leadership roles across the NSW public sector including in the former Department of Premier & Cabinet, Crown Lands and as the CEO of the Lord Howe Island Board.

Stephen will represent the Far West, Orana, Central West, New England, Hunter, Central Coast, Illawarra - Shoalhaven and Southeast. Susie will represent Sydney Metropolitan, North Coast and Riverina-Murray.

A review and update of the NSW Recovery plan continues after extensive consultation and training for all Regional Delivery Teams will commence late October. The plan is due for delivery at the end of 2023.

## Relaunch of Get Ready NSW

Our Get Ready NSW campaign was launched last Friday and is designed to help thousands of households across NSW take the guesswork out of planning for natural disasters. We've worked in partnership with the Department of Customer Service to develop the Get Ready NSW website <a href="nsw.gov.au/emergency/get-ready">nsw.gov.au/emergency/get-ready</a> as the go-to resource that will guide families on how to better protect themselves from all types of natural disasters including bushfires, storms, and floods.

### Damage Assessment & Reconstruction Monitoring (DARM)

The DARM program originated from the Queensland Reconstruction Authority. The programs' purpose is to monitor the recovery and reconstruction of an area following a natural disaster by returning at intervals in time, monitoring the progress of recovery of the Local Government Area. This is accomplished by speaking directly to affected residents in their homes and assessing the properties on their recovery status.

On 8 August 2023, the NSW Reconstruction Authority undertook a Damage Assessment &

Reconstruction Monitoring (DARM) Program door knock in Parkes as a pilot program. From the success of this program further DARM's have been carried out in the Northern Rivers and surrounds, with further DARMs planned for November and December in the Northern Rivers due to the extent of the flood damage.

## **Pre-Event Recovery Plans**

Pre Event Recovery plans continue to be rolled out across the state with many LEMC's close to a draft stage for review from their respective LEMC's. Target dates are the 31 December that all LEMC's have a draft plan ready for review and approval

### 2023/2024 Bushfire Season

NSW RA staff are on standby to assist communities that maybe affected by bushfires. NSW RA staff have been involved with a community meeting at Ulan, north of Mudgee in the past couple of weeks providing information to affected residents that require assistance in recovery.

## Disaster Ready Fund (DRF)-Round 2

Over 11 million dollars was allocated in NSW in Round 1 from the DRF. Round 2 of the DRF has been announced with EOI's opening on the 6 November 2023 and closing on the 8 December 2023. Successful EOI's will be required to submit a final proposal early 2024. Funding will become available in 2024/2025.

A busy time for LLS in Emergency management

Current Bushfire Response.

## **Situation summary**

- AASFA continues to monitor fires across NSW impacting landholders.
- AASFA Hotline 1800 814 647 remains active for landholders to request assistance.

### Actions taken.

 Across NSW 107 requests for assistance have been received for 122 properties since fires commenced on 16 October.

North Coast LLS region: 8 requests for assistance have been received (+4 since last report).

- 83% are requests for fodder.
- 13% are for water re-supply.
- 93% RFAs are complete (17 RFAs ineligible, 8 fodder and 9 water).

Other areas of NSW including Hunter, Central Tablelands, South East and Northern Tablelands LLS regions:

- 9 requests for assistance have been received
- 56% for fodder
- 33% for water re-supply
- 11% transport of displaced stock

#### **Fire Ants**

## At this point there are no positive detections of Fire Ant in NSW

On 20 July, NSW DPI received a report from the National Fire Ant Eradication Program (NFAEP) of the detection of a fire ant nest in Queensland, 5.5km from the NSW border. NFAEP have commenced surveillance and additional nests have been detected nearby. Fire ants are prohibited matter in NSW under Schedule 2 of the NSW Biosecurity Act 2015. An IMT has been established to manage and prepare for the increased risk. A Biosecurity Control Order is currently in place that restricts the movement of fire ant carrier materials into NSW from the fire ant biosecurity zone or from areas within 5km of known fire ant infested areas.

## **Current Objectives**

- 1 To develop an emergency Order and compliance strategy to improve the ability to monitor and manage the movements of fire ant carriers into NSW
- 2 To improve the clarity of requirements of materials transiting through the Qld Fire ant zone into NSW
- To develop and implement a Communications Plan to raise awareness and engagement stakeholders and the community of the risks fire ats pose to NSW
- 4 Increase awareness and consistency to operational management of fire ants between NSW DPI and the national fire ant program
- 5 Strengthen engagement with the National Fire Ant Eradication Program

### Inland Rail program delivery status

The Australian Government has confirmed that Inland Rail is an important project to meet Australia's growing freight task, improve road safety and help decarbonise our economy.

In line with the Government's response to the Independent Review of Inland Rail in mid-2023, we are taking a staged approach to deliver Inland Rail.

The sections of Inland Rail between Beveridge in Victoria and Parkes in New South Wales have been prioritised for completion by 2027. Major construction on the Narrabri to North Star Phase 1 project was completed late last month.

Our immediate focus for Inland Rail north of Narromine and into Queensland is acquiring property and land access and gaining environmental approvals in areas which are not yet under construction.

Future decisions by the Australian Government on the delivery of sections north of Narromine and into Queensland will be considered when the Government has more certainty about the delivery schedule and full cost of Inland Rail.

#### What's next?

The Commonwealth Department of Climate Change, Energy, Environment and Water (DCCEEW) has determined the Narromine to Narrabri project to be a controlled action under the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation (EPBC) Act 1999*. Now that State approval has been received, the Project will be determined by the DCCEWW under an accredited assessment process. A decision is expected later this year.

### Narromine's Narwonah Material Distribution Centre update

The 400ha Narwonah Material Distribution Centre (MDC) is located on ARTC-owned land adjacent to the existing Narwonah siding, off Narwonah Siding Road, approximately eight kilometres south of the Narromine township.

Australian owned company, Martinus Rail, is constructing the Narwonah MDC and is the preferred contractor to deliver the broader Rail Corridor Program (RCP).

Martinus has now completed the first stage of construction at the Narwonah MDC.

Planning and approvals for future stages of work at Narwonah MDC is underway.
