Clause 3.19 of the Code of Meeting Practice provides that the General Manager must not include in the agenda for a meeting of the Council any business of which due notice has been given if, in the opinion of the General Manager, the business is, or the implementation of the business would be, unlawful. The General Manager must report, without giving details of the items of business, any such exclusion to the next meeting of the Council. Three Notices of Motion received from Cr Howe are deemed to be unlawful and have therefore been excluded from the agenda for the meeting.

Notices of Motion from Cr Howe: -

1. SECTION 7.11 CONTRIBUTIONS

That NSC release Levies (council shire Tax) payed (sic) by individuals Gravel pit operators for the last 5 years (list seperate) (sic)

That Council itemise for the Last 5 years where the monies have been spent.

2. TRANGIE TRANSFER STATION

That NSC do an ongoing cost analysis on the running of a Trangie Transfer Station to the current Trangie waste facility.

Background: to ensure the ratepayers don't have increase in their rates to provide this service.

3. DOLLY PARTON FESTIVAL

That NSC provide a profit and loss analysis for the Dolly Pardon (sic) Festival. Also a attendance for the Festival.

4. MURRAY DARLING ASSOCIATION

That Council write to the Murray Darling Association requesting full information on their current position and activities as the proponent of an Incinerator project within the Shire.

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Notice of Motion received from Cr Smith

5. RECORDING OF COUNCIL MEETINGS

That in the event of a power outage during a Council meeting (Ordinary or Extraordinary) Council

- (a) Use an alternative source to continue to record the meeting and
- (b) Resume normal recording immediately after the power supply resumes

Notation from Director Finance and Corporate Strategy

This would require the use of a generator. Indicative quotations would need to be sourced to allow for appropriate budgetary provisions. The new Model Code of Meeting Practice provides that meetings and public forums are to be livestreamed. The Office of Local Government may release further guidance in relation to this requirement.
