State of the Environment Shapshot

A State of the Environment (SoE) Report is an important management tool which aims to provide the community and Local Council with information on the condition of the environment in the local area to assist in decision-making.

Since 2007, the Councils of the Greater Central West Region of NSW (see map) have joined to produce Regional SoE Reports as part of Council reporting requirements.

Recent changes to NSW legislation mean that Councils are no longer required to produce SoE Reports each year, but only once every four years, in the year of the Council election (which will next be in 2016). However, the participating Councils have decided to continue reporting on an annual basis so that they can provide a detailed Regional SoE report in 2016 that covers trends in the intervening years.

This is a brief snapshot of data for the Narromine Local Government Area in 2013-14 across a range of environmental indicators as shown in the tables below. The tables provide an understanding of trends by comparing this year's data with an average of previous years. The Council snapshot report should be read in conjunction with the 2013-14 Regional SoE snapshot report.

2013-14 Highlights

- The water used by Council for irrigation increased slightly from last year.
- There was a large increase in the restocking of native fish compared with last year.
- There was a large decrease in the number of drinking water complaints compared with last year.
- The volume of material recycled per person rose sharply from last year.
- The small scale renewable energy uptake declined from last year.

CASE STUDY: Wet weather access Road Narromine Waste Depot.

Council has recently completed the construction of an all-weather access road at the Narromine Waste Depot. The access road allows for the continued operations of the waste depot in periods of wet weather. Previously, wet weather hampered operations resulting in a reduced level of service to the community. The access road was constructed over 10 days incorporating more than 475 tonnes of gravel at a cost of \$19,970.45.
