These structures will be handed over to Council. This report seeks Council's acceptance of these drainage structures in terms of Section 377 of the Local Government Act, 1993.

With the construction and upgrade of the Inland Rail's Parkes to Narromine section, drainage structures had to be constructed or upgraded at railway level crossings to improve drainage. These structures will be handed over to Council for ongoing maintenance. The table below indicates the size and location of the structures. Council is required to accept the acquisition of these structures in terms of Section 377 of the Local Government Act, 1993.

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




Staff have commenced replacement of consumer water meters that are not registering or are over 15 years of age. Staff have collected sewage samples for the NSW Health Department COVID 19 Sewage Surveillance Project.





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
